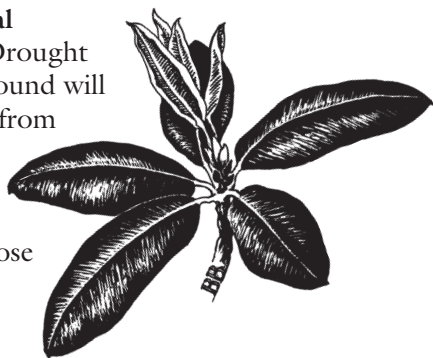

Wind Burn & Winter Kill

Affected species: Evergreens such as hemlocks, pine and spruce, or broadleaf varieties (rhododendrons are especially vulnerable)

Environmental conditions: Drought and frozen ground will prevent roots from taking up water while foliage continues to lose moisture due to drying winds.



Symptoms: Brown, burnt or thinned foliage (indicating possible death of plant).

Treatment: Natural plant derived anti-desiccant spray minimizes foliage moisture loss.

Timing of treatment: Late fall – early winter (reapplication advised every three to four months, weather permitting)
