

Office Safety & Training Specialist Job Description

Overview

The chippers Office Safety & Training Specialist (OSTS) is an Arborist Crew Leader who has extensive Arboriculture Industry knowledge, field experience, and outstanding training skills. The OSTS must be well versed in ANSI, OSHA Standards, TCIA Tree Academy, and communicates chippers "I WILL" culture of Safety. The OSTS is responsible for training employees in proper field techniques, daily job duties, communication standards, and documents completed training in an effort to provide the very safest and most efficient environment possible for our employees, clients, and general public. The OSTS will perform significant hands on training with employees focusing on OJT style teach-able moments, utilizing skills check-offs and participate in company training events. Some travel is required to expand knowledge and skill level through attending industry specific events with a goal continually improving Chippers safety culture and our desire to be a safety leader in the green care industry.

- Work in the field with crews and new hires using teach-able moments to educate and inspire a safe work environment and culture of safety
- Investigate and report on all injuries, incidents, and near misses within assigned office
- Complete new hire training and documentation
- Ensure training records are properly maintained within assigned office
- Participate in Chippers Safety Committee meetings and other safety initiatives
- Participate in structured company training events
- Gain outside training perspective through professional development outside of Chippers
